## Sowing Seeds of Truth!

Ecclesiastes 11:6 Says, "Plant your seeds early in the morning and keep working in the field until dark. Who knows? Your work might pay off, and your seeds might produce." (Contemporary English Version)



Agriculture played a vital role in ancient Hebrew society. This is why Jesus incorporated agricultural themes into His illustrations. For example, He likened the preaching of the Gospel to the sowing of seed. (Matthew 13:1-9, 18-23; Luke 8:5-15) To this day, whether we live in an agricultural society or not, sowing the Gospel seed is the most important work that Christians can do!

The Apostle Paul expressed the importance of this work when he said: "How then shall they call on him in whom they have not believed? And how shall they believe in him of whom they have not heard? And how shall they hear without a preacher? And how shall they preach, except they be sent? As it is written, How beautiful are the feet of them that preach the gospel of peace, and bring glad tidings of good things!" (Romans 10:14-15 KJV) Never before in human history has it been more important to press ahead in fulfilling this God-given commission.

Jesus made it clear very early in His ministry that His commission was that of preaching the Gospel. (Luke 4:17-21) And toward the end of his ministry He explained, "...To this end was I born, and for this cause came I into the world, that I should bear witness unto the truth. Every one that is of the truth heareth my voice." (John 18:37 KJV) During His earthly ministry of three and a half years, Jesus was fully focused on sowing the seeds of truth. He spread seeds of the Gospel at every opportunity. Even as He was dying on the cross, He proclaimed good news about a future earthly paradise. (Luke 23:43)

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#### The Visible Reveals the Invisible

In the first words of the book of Hebrews we read. "God, who at sundry times and divers manners spoke at times past unto the fathers by the prophets, has in these last days spoken unto us by His Son,..." (Hebrews 1:1-2) What a blessing! Paul is telling us what we should already know. That God has spoken and revealed Himself through real, tangible, visible people, His instruments. Even though we may not at this time be able to see God (John 1:18), He has shown Himself to us in ways we can actually see and understand. Not only by people, but by nature, by caring and love, and by His providence. His physical presence and His characteristics are invisible to us, they are too bright for us. But He has shown us Himself by what we are able to see.

Remember the old testament tabernacle that the Israelites moved with them throughout the journey to the promised land? In Exodus chapter 25 God tells Moses to make this sanctuary "so that I may dwell among them" (Exodus 25:8). And then He gives Moses the pattern of the sanctuary in Heaven and tells Moses, "therefore, even so ye shall make it" (Exodus 25:9). God was revealing the unseen or invisible tabernacle in Heaven to them in a real physical way. He was showing them the plan of salvation on a level they could understand. He used the visible to unlock the invisible.



The story of Joseph comes to mind also. If you remember, Joseph (by God's power) had become the ruler over all the house of Pharaoh and all the land of Egypt. (Genesis 41) Here we see God revealing the invisible. God is showing us that Jesus Christ, His only begotten Son, is the ruler over all of His house and over all of His kingdom. (1 Corinthians 15:24-28) By the visible example of Joseph we see an example of Christ who was invisible to us. In ruling over the king's house and kingdom, in being the judge of all the people and by giving his brothers real tangible tests, the experience of Joseph is able to reveal the work and reality of what Christ does and who Christ is. This is also a real representation of what Christ is doing in our hearts!

We reveal our invisible character in us by the visible things we say and do each day. Today, God does not need a physical sanctuary to be able to dwell with us. The invisible God Jehovah is revealed to us through the spirit of Christ which dwells in us (John 14:23). Christ Himself lives in our hearts (John 14:18) and makes an impression upon our minds. As we live out our real, tangible, physical lives we can reveal the very character of God through the spirit of Christ. The invisible is revealed by the visible! The only question that remains for each of us is, will we allow Christ, this Son of the living God, full access to our hearts and minds, in order to reveal the Father through us? Hopefully, we can answer with a confident, YES!

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## Questions From The POH Mailbox



#### Why do people say "amen" at the end of a prayer?

The word "amen," in both English and Greek, is a transliteration of the Hebrew a·men' (pronounced aw-mane'). The expression, usually uttered in unison by listeners to a prayer, oath or blessing, basically means "so be it," or "surely." Saying amen serves to indicate agreement with the sentiments just expressed. The word amen suggests certainty, truthfulness, faithfulness, and absence of doubt. In the Bible, the expression also legally obliged its user with regard to an oath or covenant and its consequences. (See Deuteronomy 27:15-26)

While preaching and teaching, Jesus introduced some of His statements with the word "amen." By doing so, He underlined the absolute reliability of what He was about to say. In these cases, the Greek word a·men' is translated "verily" In the King James Version and "truly" in some other translations. (See Matthew 5:18; 6:2, 5) When doubled, "Verily, verily" (King James Version) as is the case throughout the Gospel of John, Jesus' expression is literally translated, "Amen, amen" which means "most truly" or "truly, truly" or "Most assuredly" depending on the Bible translation you are reading. (John 1:51) Jesus' use of amen in this way is said to be unique in sacred writings.

Last, but certainly not least, in the New Testament the title "Amen" is applied to Jesus Himself, to indicate that His witness is "faithful and true." (Revelation 3:14)
